Oobleck is a type of non-Newtonian fluid. When a force, such as rolling or stirring is applied to a non-Newtonian fluid, the viscosity (resistance to flow) of the fluid increases. In simple terms, any force you exert on a non-Newtonian fluid will make the fluid behave more like a solid. The more force you exert, the harder the fluid becomes.

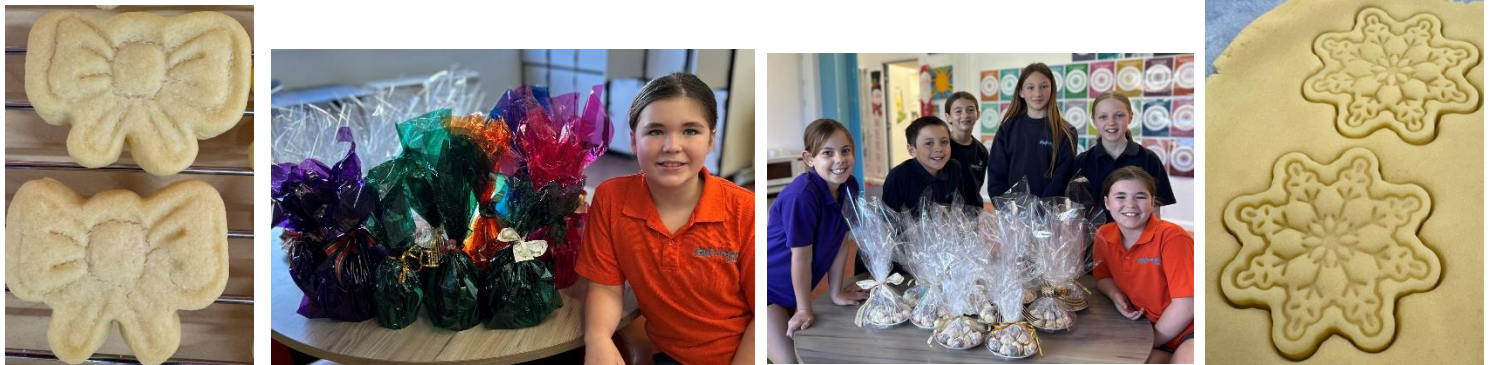
Primary Transition

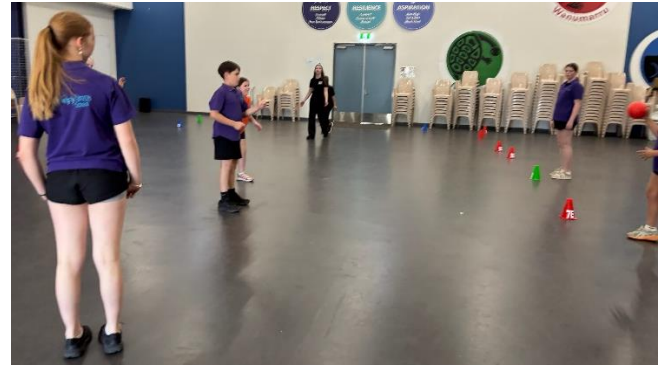
Food Tech
