On Tuesday morning the Flying Fruit Fly students in years 6,7,8 and 9 attended an online presentation on 'Mental Fitness' by Australian Institute of Sport and Black Dog. Anastasia Typou presented an engaging program and shared her journey as a young person training to be an elite athlete and experiencing complex injuries and surgery. Anastasia shared her challenge with mental fitness and how she was supported to remain in her Taekwondo community and to remain training. Anastasia is now training to be a psychologist and did go to the Olympics in Paris to support her partner in Taekwondo. We are grateful to Anni Davey from the FFFC who was present in the presentation and could add to questions and comments. Thank you to the students who offered feedback and asked great questions. SCHOOL DOG RULES

Thanks for helping look after our best friend

Ask Before You Pat! — Always ask the dog's handler before touching.

Walk, Don't Run! — Running can make dogs too excited or nervous. Move calmly around them.
